Parks Department

- Carmel Clay Parks & Recreation has been working diligently to begin opening some of our facilities on Memorial Day weekend, as permitted by the Governor's Back on Track Indiana plan and his most recent Executive Order 20-28 issued on Thursday (5/21/2020). Following is a highlight of what is opening this weekend:
- All sections of the Monon Greenway will be open by noon on Friday (5/22/2020)
 - Residents are encouraged to avoid use of the Monon Greenway when busy, consider visiting the trails within our parks as an alternative, and to always maintain physical distancing
 - Hand sanitizer stations have been placed along Monon Boulevard and within Midtown Plaza
 - Trailhead restrooms have been sanitized and will open on Friday (5/22/2020)
- Parks and open spaces are open, with some amenities remaining closed
 - Playgrounds and splash pads remain closed until further notice per Indiana Executive Order 20-28
 - Central Park skate park will open on Friday (5/22/2020)
 - Central Park dog park will partially open on Friday (5/22/2020), with the large grass section remaining closed due to wet conditions
 - Restrooms have been sanitized and will open on Friday (5/22/2020) in the following locations:
 - Central Park (dog park & east woods latrine); Westermeier Commons restrooms remain closed
 - Hazel Landing Park (portable toilet and hand washing station)
 - Meadowlark Park (portable toilet and hand washing station)
 - o West Park (core area); Jill Perelman Pavilion restrooms remain closed
 - Restrooms that support playgrounds remain closed
- The Monon Community Center will open on Sunday (5/24/2020) for current members and by reservation only

- Reservations are available for up to one week in advance. Through the end of day Thursday, members have made 2,759 reservations. The 11 am time slot for Sunday (5/24/2020) is full and most of the lap pool times have been reserved for the first week.
- The gymnasium, track, activity pool, and KidZone remain closed
- Members may elect to suspend their pass until 6/14/2020 or 7/4/2020 if they are not comfortable resuming their workouts or the amenities they most frequently use remain closed. Membership Billing Suspension Form must be submitted to continue to defer payments. To date, 432 members have elected to suspend their passes.
- MCC will be available for use by members only through 7/4/2020.
